

# Jay Hackely Eller

Jay Hackely Eller, aged 50, of R.R. 1, Mishawaka, died at 2:50 o'clock Monday morning in St. Joseph's hospital. He had been ill two days following a sudden heart attack. Mr. Eller was born here July 9, 1891, and had spent his life in this community. He was married to Miss Lulu Grace Profit in Elkhart in 1917. He is survived by his wife, one son, Max H. Eller, at home; two brothers, Lucius Eller, of R.R. 1, Osceola, this county, and Clinton N. Eller, of this city. The Rev. Wayne Eller, pastor of the Osceola Methodist Church, and the Rev. Hazen Sparks, pastor of the Jamestown Methodist Church, officiated at the funeral services in the Osceola church at 2:30 o'clock Wednesday afternoon. William Cushing, Joseph Sheets, Lauren Myers, Henry Stark, Daniel Smith and Ray Oakley were the pallbearers, and burial was in the Osceola cemetery. Note: Jay Hackely Eller is buried in the Osceola cemetery at the SE corner (the intersection of U.S. 33 (Lincoln Highway) and the St. Joseph-Elkhart County Line Road. It is interesting that Jay and his brother Clint were married to two sisters on the same day, 31 December 1917 - New Year's Eve. Each of them had one son, Jay Eller and Grace Profit had Max; Clint Eller and Hazel Profit had Warren. Jay died 23 January 1942. His brother Clint died in July 1942, less than six months later.
