

along with his wife, 2 sons and a daughter-in-law. I couldn't wait to get home and look in my



From the Webmaster . . . Harvey Powers

There are a number of good genealogy websites. However, most charge for their service. A few allow some access for free but charge for the more detailed information. Perhaps the most extensive information is on Ancestry.com. As I've said before, Ancestry has a lot of information including links to primary data like census, birth, death and marriage information. It also has family trees submitted by its users which, in some cases, may not be well documented and in a few cases, are

just plain wrong.




One FREE website that I've found especially useful is Find-A-Grave (findagrave.com). It does not cost to SEE their information. In many cases, you can find a headstone photo, birth/death dates, and sometimes children and parents' names, and occasionally a photo of the deceased and an obituary. It usually won't include living children, spouses or parents.

Find-A-Grave says it has the "largest collection of gravesite information" with more than 250 million memorials. I have found hundreds of Ellers listed.

The company that operates Find-A-Grave has just made some significant changes. It will be "holding back" parts of a listing until three-months after a person's death. Find-A-Grave says its members have complained that finding the online posting of the memorial immediately after someone's passing "...can add to the emotional strain."

To add or correct information or add a headstone photo, one has to create an account (free) and log in. Also now, when one adds a grave/memorial, you will also be asked if you are a "close relative." If you are, then your relationship can be (but doesn't have to be) shown on the memorial page. Finally, "close relatives" have a year to "claim" a Find-A-Grave listing and become the manager for it.

Board/Directors Meeting Minutes

The January 30, 2022 Board/Directors meeting (by phone) was called to order by president Steve Eller at 9:07pm EST. Present on the call were Steve Eller, Emily Cook, Lauren Liggett, Dan Liggett, Corrine Casper, Anna Bliss, Jerry Kendall and Harvey Powers. Ed Eller and David Eller were unable to attend.

Steve asked for an update from Lauren about the EFA non-profit status. The EFA has been registered as a non-profit organization in Texas. Next was to apply for an EIN number (Employer Identification Number) for banking purposes. Once that is received, we can apply for tax-exempt status [501(c)7] with the Texas Secretary of State so no taxes will need to be paid. Once that is complete, the EFA will again be non-profit/tax exempt.

Harvey had several items to discuss:

- Indiana Conference. He has sent more than a dozen letters (not emails) to Ellers and churches in the area. Gotten only a couple responses: Airport and Historical society. None from the area Ellers. He plans to physically visit the area with his son, but if no further progress is made by next January, we will be forced into Plan B. Toward that possibility, a brief discussion occurred that mentioned that Plan B might be include King George County (John Jacob Eller) or Roanoke County (Roanoke/Jacob/George Michael Eller) in Virginia where Ellers are known to reside. Harvey mentioned that Roanoke has ample conference facilities. Any suggestions are to be sent to Dan Liggett before the next phone meeting in April/May.
- Per our Email discussion, Harvey has begun responding to Eller contributors on Ancestry, offering 10 of them a free EFA membership for the balance of 2022. No replies yet, but he just started doing this last week. This is a great idea to get people involved.
- At Steve's suggestion, Harvey has removed the link on the EFA website to the Facebook fundraiser for the Smyrna Cemetery since it is about to end.
- Harvey reported that there have been two major "denial of service" attacks on our EFA
 website that were trying to overwhelm the site with traffic. The site crashed twice. He
 contacted our hosting company and they blocked the IP addresses from where the attacks
 were launched. Hopefully that will resolve the problem.
- Harvey has been using the Newspapers.com membership the board authorized. While it has been valuable, he questions whether it has been valuable enough to justify the cost in the future.
- Harvey built a program that checks for Eller obituaries online and has been adding them to our 2022 obituary page. He still appreciates receiving obituary information in case his program misses something.

Steve reported he was nearing 25,000 names for the John Jacob Eller Book Update. In particular, the Walls Family from Anderson, SC contributed close to 1000 names to the effort. As the update effort appears to be winding down, Steve and Ed Eller intend to meet in February to go over the data and how it should be presented in the update. The 1998 version had some last names capitalized and some that were not. They would like it to be more uniform in the update. The update will include all the names in the original book with updated DOD's and burial places.

With that in mind, Emily said she had a few pages of information to send and asked how Steve wanted the information sent (paper, email, spreadsheet). Steve said however she wants to send it, but that it needs to come soon.

Corrine said she was trying to put some names together, but she was having trouble confirming anything because without record access in Ancestry.

Jerry mentioned that a really young guy in Townes County, Tony Ford, recently appeared multiple times on the Statler Brothers TV show on the Nashville Network. He played the piano and sang a lot like Jerry Lee Lewis to great response. He is an Eller descendant as a grandson of Unseld Garrett (Number 1733) in the John Jacob Eller book and likely doesn't realize that he and his wife are both Eller descendants.

Steve ended by reminding everyone to send Plan B suggestions to Dan.

The meeting adjourned at 8:30pm EST.

Looking For Indiana Ellers

The Bloomington area, and specifically Monroe County, was home to John Eller, Sr. (1786-1840), grandson of Christian Eller. He moved there from Kentucky with his family (including his mother) about 1832 and settled on the Eller Farm (about 400 acres) five miles west of Bloomington. He became a Justice of the Peace and a Probate Judge. Nearly a thousand of his descendants are documented in Eller Family database. Walton Glenn Eller III

The most recent Olympian with the Eller name is Walton Glenn Eller III, who was featured in the <u>Aug 2000 Chronicles</u> (p. 15+) near his first Olympic appearance and again in the <u>Aug 2008 Chronicles</u> (p. 19+) after he won Gold in the men's double trap (shotgun) in 2008. He participated in 5 Olympics (2000, 2004, 2008, 2012, 2016). He might have done a 6th Olympics if his beloved double trap had not been eliminated from the 2020 Olympics.

Walton "Glenn" Eller III (Walton Glenn Jr "Butch", Walton Glenn Sr, Alvis Guthrie, James Granville, James Jacob, Jacob, Joseph, Jacob Jr, Jacob Eller the immigrant) Glenn is listed in the book, "John Jacob Eller and His Descendants" on page 576. Glenn is the grandson of former EFA President Walton Eller and Nancy Eller, former EFA Secretary/Treasurer.

John Jacob "Jack" or "JJ" Eller

(October 15, 1883 – January 20, 1967)

John Eller was part of the U.S. team in the 1912 Summer Olympics, competing in the 110-meter hurdles and the Pentathlon, the latter of which was won by Jim Thorpe. In 1910, he was considered to be the "King of the Hurdlers".

He later served 37 years as a patrolman in the New York City Police Department.

Of German descent, John Eller's ancestors appear to have immigrated to New York.

According to Ancestry.com, <u>John Jacob Eller (1883-1967)</u> was married to Barbara Seidl, and his parents were John Eller (1857-1937) and **Harriet L. Baker** Eller (who also had a son named George Eller, all of whom show up on the <u>1900 US Census</u> together), and his grandparents

were Jacob Eller (1828-1885) and Anna Mary Wagner Eller (1826-1900). This Jacob Eller was

born in Germany and died in New York. The EFA database appears to echo the Ancestry account of <u>John Jacob Eller</u> (b. 1883) and stops with this <u>Jacob Eller</u>, citing Ancestry trees of the <u>Virginia</u> Mattson Family and the Russo Family Tree.

His obituary appears to confirm much of that.

Unfortunately, none of this establishes any connection to Eller lines known to the Eller Family Association, but that does not detract from the distinguished career of an Eller Olympian.

Johannes "Hans" Eller

(1910-1943)

Hans Eller was part of the German team in the 1932 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles, CA. As a rower and member of the German boat in the coxed fours competition, Hans won a Gold medal.

He was killed in action during World War II.

He was noted by K. Napp-Zinn in the May 1993 Chronicles on p. 18, but no genealogical connection was made.



Morris Eller: A Chicago Gangster

Morris Eller was born Movsha Eller in the town of Libau in Russia on 16 June 1866. ⁱ Libau (in Russian Libava) is a port city on the Baltic coast in what is now Latvia. In the 1880's, Libau had a large Jewish population with many shops run by Jews. There were several synagogues including the landmark "Great Synagogue."

It isn't completely clear why Morris left Libau. However, in 1881 and 1882 many Jews in the Russian Empire faced pogroms or anti-Jewish riots. The Russian government responded to the disorders in 1882 with the so-called "May Laws" which sought to reduce conflict by forcing the Jews into specific provinces later referred to as the "Pale of Settlement." Hundreds of thousands of Jews left Russia during the reign of the last two Tzars of Imperial Russia.



Whatever the reason, Morris emigrated to the United States in 1883 through the port of New York. At his arrival he was shown as "Hebrew" and reported he had \$15. He settled in Chicago two days after arrival on 22 September 1883. He became a naturalized citizen in 1891.

The "Daily Jewish Courier" in 1907 profiled Morris Eller's arrival as being "...poor and ... lost in this great Metropolis without money and without knowledge of the English language." The paper says he went to night school to learn English and by day was a peddler.

He soon became a bookkeeper for Jacob Lasker, a tailor of women's' clothing. He married Lasker's sister-in-law, another emigrant, Jennie Kalman, who was born in Bapin,

Poland.

Morris entered politics in 1895 when he was elected Deputy Assessor for Chicago and rapidly moved up in Chicago government – to Deputy Collector in 1896 and Deputy Recorder in 1897. He held that last position until 1907 when he ran for the seat of Alderman of the 9th Ward, replacing Abe Harris who moved to a position as Clerk of the Criminal Court.

Newspaper accounts from the time^{ii iii} indicate Morris "...long was identified with Republican politics in the 20th ward (of Chicago)."



This was a time of prohibition, organized crime and corrupt politics in Chicago. This was the time when Al Capone was the "mob" boss in Chicago. In newspaper accounts, Morris is described as "the boss" of the "bloody 20th ward." iv

In his book, "The Kosher Capones: A History of Jewish Gangsters v," author Joe Kraus suggests the Eller gang was headed by Morris Eller and his son Emanuel, the chief justice of the criminal court. Kraus describes one election when Morris faced an opponent, Octavius Granady, in what was called the "Pineapple Primary of 1928."

"Throughout the day the Eller gang sent cars all around the ward intimidating and slugging where they thought necessary. In several cases, they simply kidnapped people at gunpoint and brought them to a shanty located at 1352 S. Peoria and held them in the house by armed guards until after the polls had closed.

"Such tactics mostly cleared the streets of Eller opposition, but Granady himself was another matter. He, too, drove around the ward, rallying what supporters he could find. Eller gunmen, driving in a convoy, spotted Granady and sped after him.

"After a few blocks, they forced his car to the curb, and he got out and ran. Suddenly, rifle barrels sprouted from the Eller cars' windows, and machine guns spurted. Granady fell instantly. Some reports suggested a gunman got out of the car and fired a coup de grace; others said the cars just kept going.

"The Eller cars sped off, but they were hardly inconspicuous. Draped with bunting and other election decorations, they bore large banners urging people to reelect Morris Eller as 20th Ward committeeman. The last thing some witnesses to the murder saw was Eller's own face prominently pictured on the backs of the receding cars."

Morris Eller was one of 20 persons indicted but later cleared for "conspiracy to violate election laws." In addition, Morris was charged with "...trading political protection to vice, gambling and liquor establishments in return for votes." Eller and the others were acquitted at least partly because two of the chief witnesses against the accused men, William Sephus and Sam Watts, precinct workers, disappeared mysteriously.

As the demographics of the 20th Ward became less Jewish and more Italian, the "mob" and specifically Al "Scarface" Capone broke with Morris Eller and threw his support behind an Italian candidate. That was followed by a couple bombings of Morris' home. About 1932, he began to fade from Chicago's corrupt political life.

Morris Eller died in 1943 at the home of a grandson in Chicago.

Morris and Jennie had seven children including Emanuel "Manny" Eller (1889-1965) who was a judge in the Superior Court. Manny Eller was heavily involved in Morris' political operation. Both were associated with Mayor William "Big Bill" Thompson who had clear ties to organized crime.

Another son, Jacob "Jack" Eller (1895-1940), married and had three children. He left his wife and three children about 1933. The wife, daughter Elaine and son Karl moved to Tucson, Arizona, about 1937 so Elaine could attend the University of Arizona. The family helped run

a boardinghouse across the street from the university stadium.

Karl Eller (1928-2019) vi (pictured left) also went to the University of Arizona and went on to become an outdoor advertising mogul, CEO of the chain "Circle K" and an executive with Columbia Pictures. He donated more than \$20 million to the University of Arizona's business school, which in 1999 was renamed the Eller College of Management. vii

Eller Descendent Found: John Crunkleton

John Crunkleton was an Eller Descendant going back to Sukey through her son, William "Bill" Eller. I used to work for John as a truck driver back in the day. I had no idea he was an Eller Descendant.

Here is the beginning of a story about John written by Alex Soderstrom in April 2017 for the The Red & Black (online):



On a quiet spring afternoon, Field Street, which runs next to an empty Sanford Stadium, has one vacant parking spot. That spot, the third one on the street, sits, almost like a dog waiting for its owner to return.

On April 22, G-Day, the campus will transform from an academic institution into a jubilee of fans hungry for football. But for the first time in 40 years, that parking spot will see football come to Athens without John Crunkleton, who would often park there in his red and gray Chevy Express van, which played "Glory, Glory" every time he laid on the horn.

Crunkleton died on February 3 [2017] at the age of 92. Whether players, coaches and fans are aware, Georgia football lost a fixture of its program with the passing of Crunkleton. He attended 675 games in a span of more than 50 years, making his absence on Saturday a rare occasion.

The story of Crunkleton's life reads like an All-American odyssey reminiscent of Forrest Gump: he served in the middle of history's deadliest conflict, started an immensely successful business and shook the hand of not one but two U.S. presidents.

Eller Descendent In The News: Charley Eller

Apparently, in November 1894, an unfortunate accident took the life of 17-year-old Charley Eller. The newspaper clipping is listed below. What it does not say is that Charley was an Eller Descendent in the John Melchior Eller line.

According to the Eller database (and Ancestry.com), Charley and his brother Bob were sons of William Adam Eller and his wife Mary Jane Earnhardt of the Salisbury, NC area.

William Adam Eller was the son of John Charles Eller, who was the son of John Melker Eller, Jr., son of immigrant John Melchoir (Melker) Eller, Sr.

FATAL ACCIDENT.

Charlie Eller Shot and Kill d by His Brother Bob.

A fatal accident occurred at the home of Mr. William Eller, near Trading Ford, about 3 o'clock Saturday afternoon. His two sons, Bob, 18, and Charlie, 17 years of age, were the parties connected with the tragedy. Bob was inside the house banding a 38 caliber pistol and Charlie was stand-ing on the steps just outside the open door. One chamber of the pistol was loaded and as Bob laid it down on the bureau in the room the cartridge exploded. The ball struck Charlie in the forehead and passed out at the bick of his head, producing a wound from the effects of which he died at 9 o'clock Saturday night. The body of the unfortunate young man was buried at Union church Sunday afternoon.

The brothers were very devoted and Bob is almost crazed with grief. He fainted when he saw his brother fall at the discharge of the pistol. Yesterday he left home and it was feared that he had taken his own life. A search was instituted and he was found in the woods, but he could not be induced to return home as long as the body of his brother remained there.




Corrections to the Chronicles


- The microfilm that you have diligently searched page by page will have an index at the end.





James Hook printed the first work on the Eller genealogy in 1925 titled: James Hook and Virginia Eller. He printed the second edition on the Eller family after thirty-two years titled: George Michael Eller and Descendants of His in America. However, only a few copies of Hook's first two published works are still in existence.

According to tradition, the Eller ancestors were from the Palatinate of Germany, where Eller is the name of at least five villages. Eller means "dweller near the elder trees." The name was confirmed as being of German origin by its coat of arms, which was found in Reirstap's Armorial General P1 CCLXIII as well as by the will of George Michael Eller, written in German (1778) and recorded in Frederick County, Maryland. Strong evidence showing George Michael to the son of Georg Eller of Kaltenbrunn, Untermerzbach, Bavaria exists, showing George as the second son of the union of Georg and Margaretha Huels Eller.

Margaretha Eleonor Sallén began researching the Eller lineage in 1966 until her death in 1973 when it continued with David until completed and printed in late 2012. Each chapter focuses on nine generations of these figureheads: George Michael Eller, James Scott, John Martin, Sr., William Gallaway, Robert Harper, Sr., William Smith Bryan, and John R. Stewart.
